Hope you are doing well even though we have had some cool weather recently.

I'm sure you are aware of the "Retire Well" comment on the sign at the entrance to our community. However, what you may not be aware of is that our properties appear to be unrestricted in terms of what ages of people can purchase or rent properties in Clemson Downs. The Restrictive Covenants and Bylaws do not seem to address an age restriction. This could mean that any person of legal age can purchase property here.

This fact has become a concern for your CDPOA Board in recent months as the prices of homes go higher and the availability of homes in the Clemson Area become increasingly scarce. Although your CDPOA Board will not support young families moving into Clemson Downs, the fact that we have a beautiful and pleasant neighborhood, live in an area known for good schools, and have access to parks nearby where children could play may provide the incentive for young families to attempt to purchase homes in Clemson Downs.

So, the Board has taken a project to research what we need to do to restrict purchase and residential occupancy in Clemson Downs to ages 55 and older. We will keep you apprised of our progress in the coming months. We may ask for help from individual members who may have requisite expertise as we move forward. Lastly, if we are successful in this effort, we will probably need your vote at the end of this year to change the Covenants and Bylaws, as necessary.

Things to Remember

Blowing leaves onto common property

Please do not blow leaves from your yard onto common property. Our maintenance contract includes pick up of leaves on common property. But when individuals or their landscapers blow their leaves on to common property and our maintenance people have to pick them up numerous times, we will be billed an additional fee. This also includes the median along Downs Blvd. Excess leaves in the median clogs up drainage and can cause water problems for other homeowners.

Parking in the median

We have had a problem with contractors parking on our medians. The Downs median is a drainage ditch and must be kept open. Deep ruts on our medians are unsightly and cause erosion. Deep ruts on Downs Blvd. at the end of Downs Loop make it difficult for walkers to get off the road when cars are approaching. Please encourage any contractors working on your property to avoid parking in the median.
